## From the President

Dear PAWS Supporter,

Christmas came early for Centre County PAWS this year with the opening of the new adoption and education center. A new home for PAWS has been at the top of our volunteers' wish lists for a very long time, and to see it become a reality is a dream come true for all of us. I hope that you have had a chance to visit the PAWS animals in the new center. It has been so satisfying to see how the day-to-day operation of PAWS has been improved by the new facility. The animals have more spacious quarters, with volunteers coming by morning and evening to care for them. The meet and greet rooms allow adopters to get to know available animals one on one, interacting without any distractions. This has enhanced our placement process and some of our longer term residents have found their forever homes this fall (see Moxie's story on page 5). PAWS has been able to accommodate groups performing community service projects, and next year will begin to offer low cost spay/neuter clinics on site. This new building truly is a community resource and PAWS volunteers are looking forward to finding more ways to promote responsible companion animal ownership.

Our shelter supervisor, Lisa Bahr, keeps everything running smoothly; you can meet her on page 4. Two successful fundraisers this

fall, the PAWS Pet Extravaganza and the Fur Ball (see inside for more details) have helped PAWS to raise funds needed to complete and equip the building. We are truly grateful for the support that we have received so far. However, we are still short of our goal. Please consider making an end of the year donation to PAWS. We are an independent, grass roots group promoting animal welfare in the Centre Region. The opening of the new adoption and education center is a huge step for the organization, and we are confident that the community will provide the necessary support to make this transition a success. ## A Dream Come True - The PAWS Education & Adoption Center Grand Opening

After many years of dreaming, planning and fundraising, the new Centre County PAWS Adoption and Education Center is finally a reality. Two ribbon cuttings were held in early September to herald the opening of our new building at 1401 Trout Road.

The volunteer ribbon cutting was held on September 9. It was a special time for everyone in attendance. PAWS would not exist without our team of dedicated volunteers who take time out of their busy lives to make a difference for the animals. A highlight of the ribbon cutting party was the surprise announcement that the Cat Intake Room is dedicated to Debbie Bezilla's tireless efforts at PAWS. Debbie is a founding member of PAWS and since December of 1980 has seen it grow from an organization that operated out of the volunteers' homes to the current one which operates at the new center. We also recognized Linette Courtney for her tireless efforts in both fundraising and getting the building constructed.

The official public ribbon cutting was held September 10. It was gratifying to have so many public officials and generous donors in attendance. We were pleased to have Wilbur Zelinsky, the husband of Gladys Zelinsky one of the original founders of PAWS, participate in opening our new building. PAWS dogs Bourbon and Whiskey had their very own dog bone version of a ribbon to cut and sure seemed to

enjoy munching on it.

Moving day was September 22 and whether asked to clean, pack, lift, transport, or unpack, our PAWS volunteers came through again and accomplished the move into the new center in record time! As always there was shared camaraderie and fun too. We celebrated our president Carla's birthday, had lunch together and even got to see the very first PAWS adoption at the new center. Calvin, a PAWS cat, was the mascot for our move and enjoyed moving into "his" sunroom.

The grand opening of the new building took place the weekend of September 29th. There were balloons, snacks, tours, a free raffle of stuffed animals and, most importantly, an opportunity for the public to meet all the wonderful dogs and cats available for adoption.

On October 7, 2007, Father Matthew Laffey blessed the animals and the building. This was held in conjunction with the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of animals. The public was invited to bring their animals for this special ceremony.

## PAWS Hires First Shelter Supervisor

PAWS recently hired its first paid employee ever - Lisa Bahr! Lisa is our new shelter supervisor and is responsible for assisting with day-to-day shelter operations and working with volunteers and the Board to ensure the animals receive the best care possible. She is a 2007 graduate of The Ohio State University and majored in Agriculture. Lisa took some time from her busy schedule to answer some questions about her herself.

### What got you interested in working with animals?

I've never been able to come up with a good answer to this question, despite having been asked a number of times. I remember finding a stray cat and secretly keeping him in my best friend's garage until her parents walked in about an hour later. I was so surprised and incredibly happy when they decided to keep him. I have just loved animals for as long as I can remember and consider myself very lucky to have been given this job.

### Did you have pets when you were growing up?

Even though I asked for a dog for every Christmas, birthday, and good report card, I was never allowed to have one until I was in the sixth grade. A black lab/ chow mix walked into my Mom's work and she just couldn't send her back outside. She stayed with us until just a few months ago when she passed away very suddenly. Maggie was a wonderful dog and is definitely the reason I love to have dogs around, especially the more independent breeds like Chows and Akitas.

### What other animal related groups have you worked or volunteered with?

I started devoting a lot of time volunteering when I was in high school. For a few years I spent just about every weekend at the SPCA in Cincinnati. I moved to Arkansas for 4 months to do my internship with Heifer Ranch of Heifer International. While I have volunteered with other organizations throughout college, those two places had the largest impact on me.

### Do you currently have any pets of your own?

I have a very handsome 4 year old Akita named Solomon. He was abandoned when he was 10 months old at the vet clinic where I worked throughout college.

### What has been the most surprising thing about your new job with PAWS?

While I was home for Thanksgiving I was asked by a family member which animal was my favorite. I couldn't come up with an answer, or even narrow it down! I never would have expected just how attached I would get to every single one of the animals who comes to us, no matter how brief that time may be.

Moxie's story is a perfect illustration of the importance of the work PAWS does and is a tribute to our wonderful volunteers and supporters.



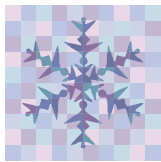
personality was always top notch. While at our old adoption center, Moxie made sure he told us exactly what he thought about being there. It was clear that his meows could be translated to "GET ME OUTTA THIS CAGE!" Distressed by the number of cats and their proximity to him, Moxie was so stressed at the old center, that he could only come in once a month. The rest of the time he lived with his foster Mom. His eventual happy ending was due in large part to her love and dedication to him during most of his 2 years with PAWS.

The last remaining member of the inaugural *Lonely Hearts Club*, Moxie came into PAWS over 2 years ago. Many of our volunteers have never known PAWS without Moxie, me included. Shortly after Moxie came into PAWS, medical problems began to surface. First, hair loss that was originally attributed to rubbing against the doors of his cage and then the discovery that Moxie had chewed his tail until it bled, something no one at PAWS had ever seen before. A diligent vet was one of Moxie's many angels. What was initially thought to be a food allergy turned out to be an unusual condition that caused phantom pain in his tail and surgery was in order. Moxie's first surgery removed the portion of his tail that seemed to be giving him pain, but unfortunately, that wasn't enough. After some time it became apparent that further surgery was needed, and so began Moxie's life as a manufactured Manx!

Throughout Moxie's journey, he has become a very special cat in the hearts of everyone who meets him. Despite life's curves, his

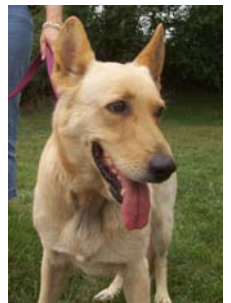
**Izzie**

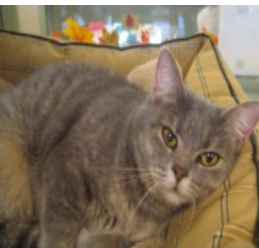
**Mr. Bojangles**
