## FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friend of PAWS,

PAWS was founded 32 years ago by eight wonderful women (**Debbie Bezilla, Jan Doolittle, Toni Duchi, Judy Ebbinghaus, Ann McMichael, Nancy Miller, Shirley Verhaeg and Gladys Zelinsky**). They started PAWS from their homes and initially adopted only cats in our community. In 1995, **Dr. Fred Metzger** gave PAWS an 800 square foot building to use to house PAWS cats. At that point, PAWS volunteers began placing dogs, which were housed in foster homes and at **Lyons Kennels**.

Over the years, PAWS continued to grow. Four years ago, we moved to our current home, a 14,000 square foot facility located at 1401 Trout Road. We place hundreds of cats and dogs in their forever homes each year, and we strive each and every day to do the best we can for our cats and dogs, as well as their potential adopters.

However, from time to time, we hear that our expectations are too stringent or unrealistic. Please allow me this opportunity to explain what we do and why.

At PAWS, we not only have a responsibility to find forever homes for our cats and dogs, but we have a responsibility to our adopters as well. We work extremely hard to match each potential adopter with the perfect dog or cat that will fit into their family. Our goal is to make the optimal match the first time, so that the family does not have to go through the trauma of returning the pet. We know that it is not only traumatic for the pet when it is returned, but for the family as well.

I am sure that you have heard many stories about how the dogs and cats get to PAWS. Many of those stories are so sad that they will make you cry. If you have been to PAWS, you will know that numerous animals come to us with special issues (e.g., they don't like small children, they don't like other dogs, they don't like other cats). While these issues do not mean the animals are not wonderful and will not make a perfect match for adopters, it means that we must take additional care to make certain that the fit with the adopting family is as mutually rewarding as possible.

Because we want the experience for potential adopters and the dogs and cats to be as perfect as humanly possible, we ask a lot of questions when you visit and apply for one of our animals. We want you to know how much we appreciate your understanding in this important process, which may sometimes seem more involved than one might anticipate. However, we do so in the very best interest of the cat or dog being adopted, and the adopter who will provide the forever loving home.

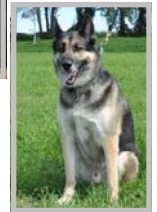
Thank you so much for your continuing generosity and thoughtfulness. I hope you have a wonderful holiday season, and a prosperous New Year.

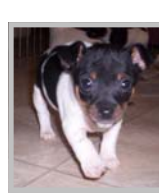

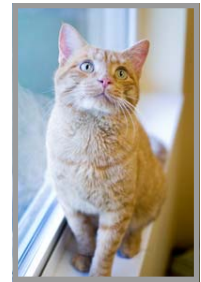

## VOLUNTEER VOICE— FROM PAWS VOLUNTEERS TO YOU

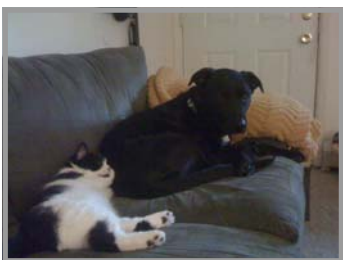

 see for yourself just how soft and cuddly I am.

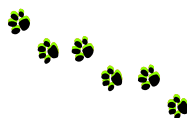


**H**ello, All! I’m **Shelley**. I used to keep rather a

## STUBBY'S HOMECOMING

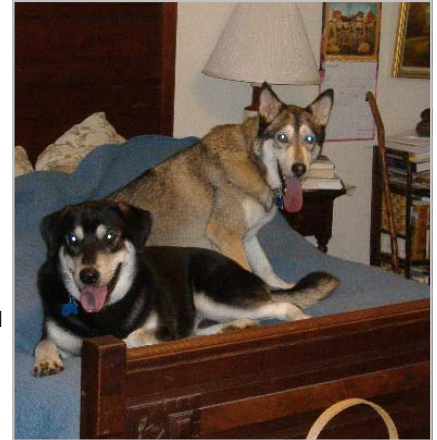
