**You qualify for a PAWS clinic if you**

- meet income restrictions listed below
- live or work full-time in Centre County

**Acceptable examples of low income status**

- Proof of current participation in a government assistance program
- A copy of last year’s tax return showing income equal to or less than 250% of the current federal poverty guidelines (*see back*)
- A copy of valid student ID (students are always accepted)

**Restrictions**

- Feral/wild cats are not accepted into PAWS clinics.
  - There are no refunds once a spot is reserved.
    - Limit of 2 animals per household.
- **Incomplete applications will not be accepted.** Applications must include: proof of low income status, payment, and a completed PAWS SNAP Clinic application (*see right*).

**Please note:**

- If you submit an incomplete application, you will be sent a PAWS SNAP voucher instead of admitted to the clinic.
- A PAWS representative will contact you **the week of the clinic** to let you know if you have been accepted and provide care/drop-off instructions.
- You must bring photo identification with you when dropping off your animal for a clinic.
